The body of one of the most widely known and beloved Masons was laid to rest in Hillcrest Mauseleum. Garrett Commandery lost a true friend and loyal supporter in the passing of Sir Knight Gilbough. Sept. 7 - Stated Conclave--covered dish dinner with a fine attendance. Sir Knight: Leonard A. Huffhines, Carrol, Embry and Walter Glidewell were the recipients of the delectable degree of Sons of Pharosh much to the delight of all present, especially the ladies. Sir Knight Edward A. Copley presented a large beautiful Crucifix for use in the Orders of Malta and Temple.

Sept. 14 - Sir Knight Vance K. Miller presented to the Commandery a beautiful silk Texas Flag to match the United States Flag gracing the East.
