There were 126 registered for this splendid conclave and there were 111 present for dinner whichwas served by the ladies of the S.O.O.B.

The Order of RED CROSS was conferred in the Garret manner having the Banquet Scene etc., which was transported from Garrett to the Temple in Sir Knight DeHay's truck and back home in cars furnished by Terrill, Bradshaw and Hefner. This beautiful Order was conferred by Harry Tuer with Dale Milleras Chancellor, Lloyd Harrell as Master Palace

Glaude Creekmore as Master Cavalry and Dick Sands as Conductor.

The report from the Commanderies: Dallas No.6 reported that their Commandery has passed a resolution that they wanted to be Co-host and wanted to invite the Grand Command-

ery to hold its 110th Grand Conclave in Dallas. Tand cred Commander Purnell advised that they had passed a MOTION that they too wanted to invite the Grand Conclave for 1963 to be held in Dallas and that they too would be co-host and take care of their prorated cost of the Grand Conclave. Many other things were discussed but the most important thing accomplished was the election of our own Dale E. Miller as General Chairman for the 1963 Conclave with full power to act in that capacity and that any future meeting would be called by the General Chairman. It was moved that each Commandery contribute \$100.00 to the General Fund for the purpose of defraying any expenses that might present themselves in the preparation period.

As of this date there are only 18 of the original signers members of the Commandery. Of the 99 members of the Commandery at this time who are CHARTER MEMBERS there were 32 present. The original number of Charter Members was 114. Those present were.

This type of case is not taken by the eye foundation. It was thought best NOT to have this expense paid by the Commandery since we felt it was a matter we did not want the Commandery mixed up in. By the contribution made it shows that charity and love for human kind is still in the hearts of men and particularly Knights Templar. By way of explanation, the Doctor is donating his services which is to be appreciated. Thus closed the 13th anniversary of Alexander C. Garrett Commandery by a most fervent prayer offered by our Ex.
